



Wellness care for your kitten means longer life!

Providing the proper care for your kitten from the beginning means a longer, healthier life. Below are our recommendations for a strong start. It's important to make sure your pet does not miss any of the booster vaccinations or it will not be fully protected. If your kitten gets off to a late start, the visits will be done every 3-4 weeks until your kitten is between 16-20 weeks old, with a minimum of 2 visits.

7 WEEKS OLD

- Comprehensive physical exam
- Check for feline leukemia and aids
- 1st round of vaccinations: FVRCP
- Discuss dietary needs, litter box training, socialization and general behavior
- Check for intestinal worms/deworm
- Microchip (optional)

10 WEEKS OLD

- Comprehensive physical exam
- 2nd round vaccinations: FVRCP booster
- Begin heartworm & flea/tick prevention

13 WEEKS OLD

- Comprehensive physical exam
- 3rd round vaccinations: FVRCP booster, Feline Leukemia (*if at risk*), Rabies
- Check for intestinal worms/deworm

16 WEEKS OLD

- Comprehensive physical exam
- Final kitten vaccinations: FVRCP booster, Feline Leukemia booster (*if at risk*)

SPAY / NEUTER recommended at 4 - 6 months of age.

If you adopt an older kitten or cat without vaccine history, you will want to follow this schedule:

- 1st Visit → Comprehensive physical exam → Check for feline leukemia and aids
→ Heartworm and flea/tick prevention → Check for intestinal worms/deworm
→ Vaccinations: FVRCP booster, Feline Leukemia (*if at risk*), Rabies
→ Discuss dietary needs, socialization and general behavior

- 2nd Visit → Return in 3-4 weeks to booster the FVRCP and Feline Leukemia (*if at risk*)
