



## Wellness care for your puppy means longer life!

Providing the proper care for your puppy from the beginning means a longer, healthier life. Below are our recommendations for a strong start. It's important to make sure your pet does not miss any of the booster vaccinations or it will not be fully protected. If your pet gets off to a late start, the visits will be done every 3-4 weeks until your puppy is between 16-20 weeks old, with a minimum of 2 visits.

### 7 WEEKS OLD

- Comprehensive physical exam
- 1<sup>st</sup> round of vaccinations: Distemper/Parvo (DA2PP)
- Check for intestinal worms/deworm
- Microchip (optional)
- Discuss dietary needs, potty training, socialization and general behavior

### 10 WEEKS OLD

- Comprehensive physical exam
- 2<sup>nd</sup> round vaccinations: Distemper/Parvo (DA2PP) booster, Bordetella (*oral*)
- Begin heartworm and flea/tick prevention

### 13 WEEKS OLD

- Comprehensive physical exam
- 3<sup>rd</sup> round vaccinations: Distemper/Parvo/Lepto (DA2PPL4), Rabies
- Fecal test and deworming

### 16 WEEKS OLD

- Comprehensive physical exam
- Final puppy vaccinations: Distemper/Parvo/Lepto (DA2PPL4), Bordetella (*injectable*)

**SPAY / NEUTER recommended at 4 - 6 months of age.**

If you adopt an older puppy or dog without vaccine history, you will want to follow this schedule:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Visit → Comprehensive physical exam → Check for intestinal worms/deworm
- Vaccinations: Distemper/Parvo/Lepto, Bordetella (*oral*), Rabies
  - Heartworm and flea/tick prevention
  - Discuss dietary needs, socialization and general behavior

2<sup>nd</sup> Visit → Return in 3-4 weeks to booster the Distemper/Parvo/Lepto and Bordetella (*injectable*).
